As the COVID-19/Coronavirus (COVID-19) continues to spread and affect our lives, the only certainty seems to be uncertainty. Please continue to monitor the websites of the local health departments and the U.S. Center for Disease Control and taking the steps to support applicable directives and maintain a clean and safe environment for your patrons. Most, if not all, communities are currently being advised to avoid travel and to practice some level of "social distancing" designed to curb the spread of the virus. These generally include increasing hand-washing and use of hand sanitizer and regularly cleaning high-touch surfaces as well as maintaining a six-foot distance from other individuals in public places. Several California counties are also now subject to mandatory "shelter-in-place" orders requiring individuals to self-isolate in their residences except to the extent necessary to perform or obtain certain "essential services".

We recommend cleaning standards be implemented by your independent janitorial Company. Restrooms should be thoroughly cleaned nightly with disinfectants including toilets, urinals, plumbing fixtures, sinks, counter tops, stall handles and floors. Cleaning personnel should wear latex gloves and dispose of them, nightly. Railings, doorknobs, light switches, etc., should be wiped down daily with appropriate disinfectants.
